

HIV Prevention

The following organizations provide HIV education and prevention services in Contra Costa. Many of these organizations offer personalized Case Management services for those who want on-going support and information to make informed decisions about their health. CENTER FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

The Center for Human Development's Empowerment Program provides education, social support, and leadership opportunities for gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and questioning (LGBTQ) youth age 22 and under.

CONTRA COSTA HEALTH SERVICES AIDS PROGRAM

The AIDS Program coordinates education, prevention, and testing services throughout Contra Costa.

CONTRA COSTA HEALTH SERVICES TEENAGE PROGRAM (TAP)

TAP is a comprehensive program designed to address the physical, social, and emotional concerns of Contra Costa County youth. Services include health education presentations in high school settings, teen clinic navigator program, youth development, and mentoring projects.

FAMILIAS UNIDAS

Familias Unidas conducts a wide spectrum of programs, primarily for the Latino community, especially in West Contra Costa. Specific HIV prevention service for men who have sex with men are available. Other services are available for people living with HIV/AIDS.

NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSE OF NORTH RICHMOND

Neighborhood House provides HIV/AIDS education and neighborhood outreach to men who have sex with men and transgendered in the Richmond community.

PLANNED PARENTHOOD SHASTA-DIABLO

PPSD offers a full range of reproductive health services. Specific HIV education, outreach and counseling services for women and youth are available. A Resource Center in the Concord office houses videos, pamphlets, fact sheets and other useful information available for public use.

PITTSBURG PRE-SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The Pittsburg Pre-School and Community Council (PSCC) specializes in providing HIV education, outreach, testing, and case management services for women, men who have sex with men, and substance users in East County.

CASE MANAGEMENT

services are available for people with HIV/AIDS and for people who want to stay free of HIV. These services are private and are personalized for individuals' specific needs, supporting them to stay healthy.

- **HIV CASE MANAGEMENT:** Case management service for people with HIV/AIDS focuses on medical care and other factors that influence access to medical care.
- **PREVENTION CASE MANAGEMENT:** Case management service for people who are more vulnerable to contracting HIV or passing on HIV. It focuses on building understanding and skills about factors that influence people's ability to stay HIV free or transmit HIV.
